Communities in Schools Student Eligibility and Planned Services

Jefferson Davis High School, Texas

Topic: Dropout Prevention

Practice: Academic Supports

Communities in Schools (CIS) partners with Jefferson Davis High School to provide additional support in dropout prevention and recovery efforts, working with students to minimize the barriers to graduation. Students who participate in CIS receive one-on-one attention from staff dedicated to making sure they stay in school and graduate.

This sample material includes two forms used by CIS:

- **Student Eligibility Checklist.** Before a student can be enrolled in the program, a teacher must complete this form to establish the student's eligibility based on Texas Education Code At-Risk Criteria. The criteria for participation in CIS include grade retention, low academic performance, teen pregnancy, homelessness, discipline or criminal problems, mental illness, English language learner (ELL) status, and free/reduced-price lunch eligibility.
- **Student Assessment and Service Plan.** Once a student is identified as eligible for the program, CIS staff members use this form to determine the specific services required to address the student's

individual barriers to success. Barriers are broken down by category (e.g., academics, academic support, attendance, behavior, and social services) and the recommended support services are identified by a number code:

- o 100 = Supportive guidance
- o 200 = Health and human service linkage
- o 300 = Parental involvement
- o 400 = Cultural enrichment
- o 500 = Academic enrichment
- o 600 = Career awareness

School administrators and academic support program leaders can adapt this form for their own needs according to the dropout prevention efforts in place. Student is determined eligible for CIS services if at least one eligibility criteria below is met. All applicable criteria must be checked.

TEC At-Risk Criteria (Texas Education Code §29.081 (d) 1 thru 13 (g))

A student at risk of dropping out of school includes each student who is under 21 years of age, and who:

- ☐ 1 was not advanced from one grade level to the next for one or more school years.
- ☐ 2 if the student is in grade 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 or 12, did not maintain an average equivalent to 70 on a scale of 100 in two or more subjects in the foundation curriculum (Section 28.002) during a semester in the preceding or current school year, or is not maintaining such an average in two or more subjects in the foundation curriculum in the current semester.
- ☐ 3 did not perform satisfactorily on an assessment instrument administered to the student under Subchapter B, Chapter 39, and who has not in the previous or current school year subsequently performed on that instrument at a level equal to at least 110 percent of the level of satisfactory performance on that instrument.
- ☐ 4 is a student in pre-kindergarten, kindergarten, or grade one, two or three who did not perform satisfactorily on a readiness test or assessment instrument administered during the current school year.
- ☐ 5 is pregnant or is a parent.
- ☐ 6 has been placed in an alternative education program in accordance with Section 37.006 during the preceding or current school year.
- ☐ 7 has been expelled in accordance with Section 37.007 during the preceding or current school year.
- ☐ 8 is currently on parole, probation, deferred prosecution, or other conditional release.
- ☐ 9 was previously reported through the Public Education Information Management System (PEIMS) to have dropped out of school.
- ☐ 10 is a student of limited English proficiency as defined by Section 29.052.
- ☐ 11 is in the custody or care of the Department of Protective and Regulatory Services or during the current school year, is referred to the department by a school or law enforcement official or a juvenile court officer.
- ☐ 12 is homeless as defined by 42 U.S.C. Section 11302 and its subsequent amendments.
- ☐ 13 resided in the preceding school year or resides in the current school year in a residential placement facility in the district, including a detention facility, substance abuse treatment facility, emergency shelter, psychiatric hospital, halfway house, or foster group home.

Additional Legislative Eligibility Criteria

- ☐ 14 is eligible for free or reduced lunch. (Texas Education Code 33.151)
- ☐ 15 is involved in a family conflict or crisis. (Texas Education Code 33.151)
- ☐ 16 is a Temporary Assistance For Needy Families (TANF) recipient.
