



Chronic School Absenteeism

Topic: Increased Learning Time: Beyond the Regular School Day

Practice: Maximize Attendance

Chronic school absenteeism can hinder program effects on student academic outcomes. Funding for after-school programs requires documentation showing that extended learning time programs monitor and address absenteeism. The *Chronic School Absenteeism* form, , developed by the CHAMPS after-school program, is designed to record a student's absences and, more importantly, the reasons for those absences. The form has two main parts: a place to note reasons for chronic absenteeism based on student, parent, and homeroom teacher interviews and the site manager's recommended steps. After-school program site managers gather information and submit the form to the program supervisor. Interventions a site manager may recommend include change of program services (e.g., added mentoring, change of class schedule); conferences with the principal, counselor, or nurse; a home visit; or involving the School Assistance Program (SAP) team.

Information gathered on chronic absentees can provide helpful feedback about the program or particular problems the student may be having. This information can be used to improve the program or intervene and assist the individual student.
