Reducing Behavior Problems in the Elementary School Classroom

Modify Environment

Modify the classroom environment to prevent problem behavior.

Schoolwide Approach

Our suspension rates are down.

Implement schoolwide strategies or programs.

Describe Behavior

Identify the conditions that reinforce problem behavior.

You're squirmy today. Let's do an active project.

Collaborative Relationships

Form collaborative relationships with school staff, parents, and behavioral experts.

Can we try this approach at home and at school?

Teach Skills

Teach and reinforce skills to promote appropriate behavior.
