Social Studies teacher Patrice Bain uses clickers and an interactive whiteboard to give short, multiple-choice quizzes on a daily basis. With this technology students are able to get instant feedback as to whether they answered correctly or incorrectly. This immediate feedback is not only engaging and motivating to the students, but they are able to quickly see where there are gaps in their understanding. Another benefit is the teacher gets a quick reading for how well she has covered the material.

Bain will typically give a five-question pre-quiz before a lesson and a five-question review quiz after a lesson. These quiz items are revisited later in chapter and unit exams so that students are asked to recall the same key concepts on more than one occasion.
