Monday, January 7

Standards:

- 1.5.1 Read a variety of fiction and nonfiction silently and orally
- 1.5.2 Pronounce and apply vocabulary across the curriculum

Objectives:

- Students will be able to read selection vocabulary words
- Students will identify vocabulary word definitions in small groups using context clues.

Strategies:

1. TSW choral/echo read vocabulary words during “Figure Skating” reading TE pg 136-137.
2. TTW review how to use context clues to figure out word definitions.
3. TTW walk through “Competition Words” overhead, circling vocabulary words and underlining context clues.
4. TSW match vocabulary word to correct definition on table in small groups.

Materials:

- Houghton Mifflin Big Books
- Student Journal

Evaluation:

- TSW be able to pronounce and define Heart of a Champion vocabulary.

Tuesday, November 27 – Wednesday, November 28

Standards:

Objectives:

- Students will be able to read and define selection vocabulary.
- Students determine the difference between facts and opinions.
- Students will identify facts and opinions.

Strategies:

1. TSW choral/echo read vocabulary words.
2. TSW complete PB pg 95 using available resource materials.
3. TTW display different facts and opinions on the board
4. TSW discuss with a partner each sentence on the board and whether they believe it to be a fact or opinion. TSW be prepared to answer the question “How do you know?”
5. TCW discuss answers in whole-group, coming up with words that help identify opinions.
6. TSW write their definition of fact and opinion in their journals, including opinion words.
7. TSW work in small group to identify facts and opinions in group-work folders.

- Houghton Mifflin Practice Books
- Student Journal
- Fact and opinion group-work folders.

Evaluation:

- TSW read and identify vocabulary words, practice pg 95.
- TSW be able to give the definition of fact and opinion.
- Student participation in small group fact and opinion identification.
