DIAGNOSTIC PRACTICES



Data Systems

- -Examine academic performance
- -Monitor engagement and persistence
- -Track students over time



TARGETED INTERVENTIONS



Social/Behavior Programs

- Strengthen students' problem-solving and decision-making skills
- -Help students establish goals
- -Establish community partnerships



SCHOOLWIDE INTERVENTIONS



- Incorporate career themes
 Provide information about postsecondary options
- -Provide internship opportunities





Learning Environment

- -Establish small learning communities
- -Create smaller classes
- -Provide extended learning time



Academic Support

- -Provide intensive support programs
- -Offer tutoring for students who need help
- -Provide opportunities for credit recovery



Adult Advocates

- -Match advocates to student needs
- -Provide ongoing training for advocates
- -Ensure regular meeting times between
- advocates and students
