Classroom Instructional Plan

Topic: Using Student Achievement Data to Support Instructional Decision Making

Practice: Supports for Data-Driven Culture

Thurgood Marshall Academy Public Charter School administers benchmark assessments on a six- to eight-week cycle. Within a week of each assessment, administrators and teachers meet during Data Afternoons to collaboratively analyze the data and brainstorm strategies for improving instruction. After the Data Afternoons, teachers use the *Classroom Instructional Plan* to document changes and describe their instructional plan for the next benchmark period.

Teachers document the following information in the instructional plan:

1. The percentage of students scoring at or above proficiency in reading and math on the District of Columbia Comprehensive Assessment System (DC CAS)
2. Total percentage and the number of students scoring below proficiency in each class
3. Standards that students in each class have mastered
4. Standards that students in each class have not mastered

5. Identification of areas for reteaching

6. Strategies for reteaching

Teachers can use this plan to develop a similar instructional planning template.
